Introduction

Information Breakdown

The following data and information in this booklet has been compiled from the Client Caseload Information System (CCIS) database used by the Youth Support Service in Southampton.

The content is based on the 'destinations', as at 1st November 2020, of pupils who completed Year 11 in the academic year 2019/20 and were registered on the CCIS database on the 1st June 2020.

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Destinations of Southampton Year 11 Leavers 2016 - 2020

The number of young people that met their duty to participate (RPA) in 2020 was 2095 out of a cohort of 2205, this equates to 95.01%, an increase of 1.2% compared to 93.81% in 2019. The percentage of the cohort in some form of further education has risen by almost 2.0%. The numbers into training have increased again due to a number of young people attending Football Club based training (Sholing, Eastleigh, Saints) but the percentage into employment with training, including apprenticeships, has decreased.

The number of young people who left compulsory education and were NEET on the 1st November 2020 has decreased compared to 2019. There were 53 (2.4%) young people in this group made up of 47 available for work, 5 not ready for work and 1 unavailable due to illness.

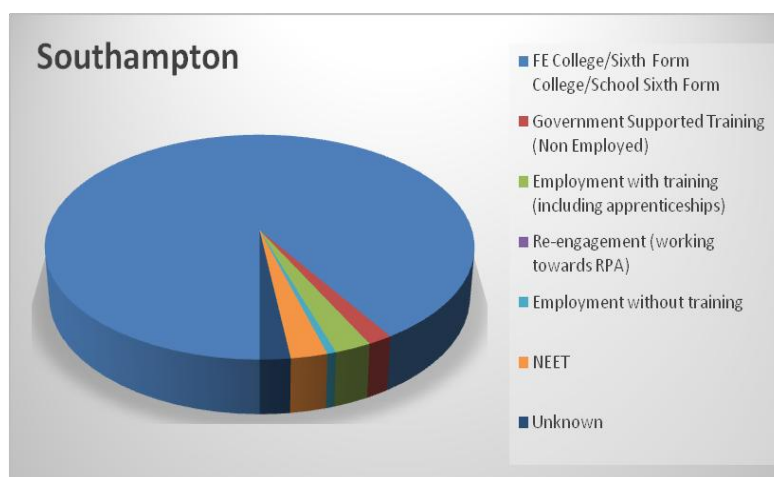
The number of young people going into employment without any accredited training has decreased this year from 23 in 2019 to 13 in 2020, partly due to the limited number of opportunities available due to the pandemic. The number of unknown destinations has increased slightly from 39 to 44, but the cohort was larger therefore the percentage is less.

The 2020 Year 11 Progression Survey main headlines for Cantell School;

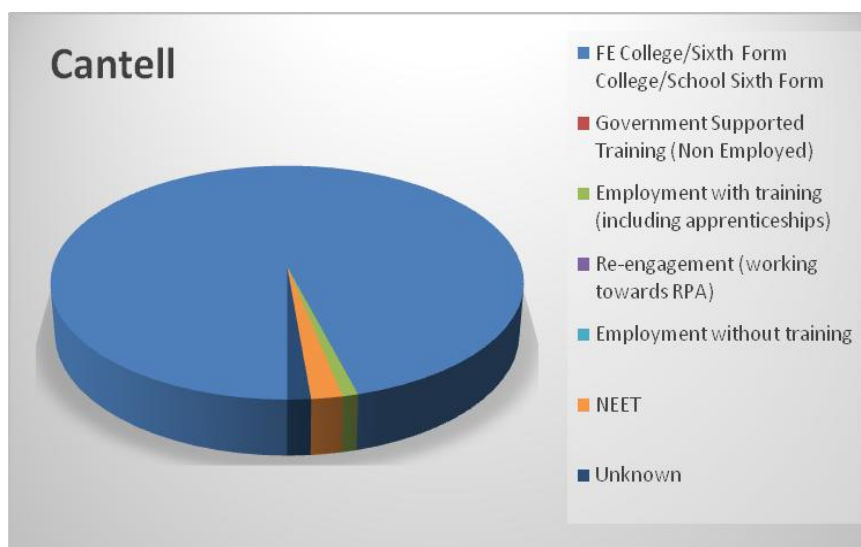
- An increase in the percentage staying on in post-16 education

RPA (Raising the Participation Age) – summary

RPA was introduced in 2013 and is a statutory requirement for all year 11 leavers to continue into a participating destination such as education, training or employment with accredited training.

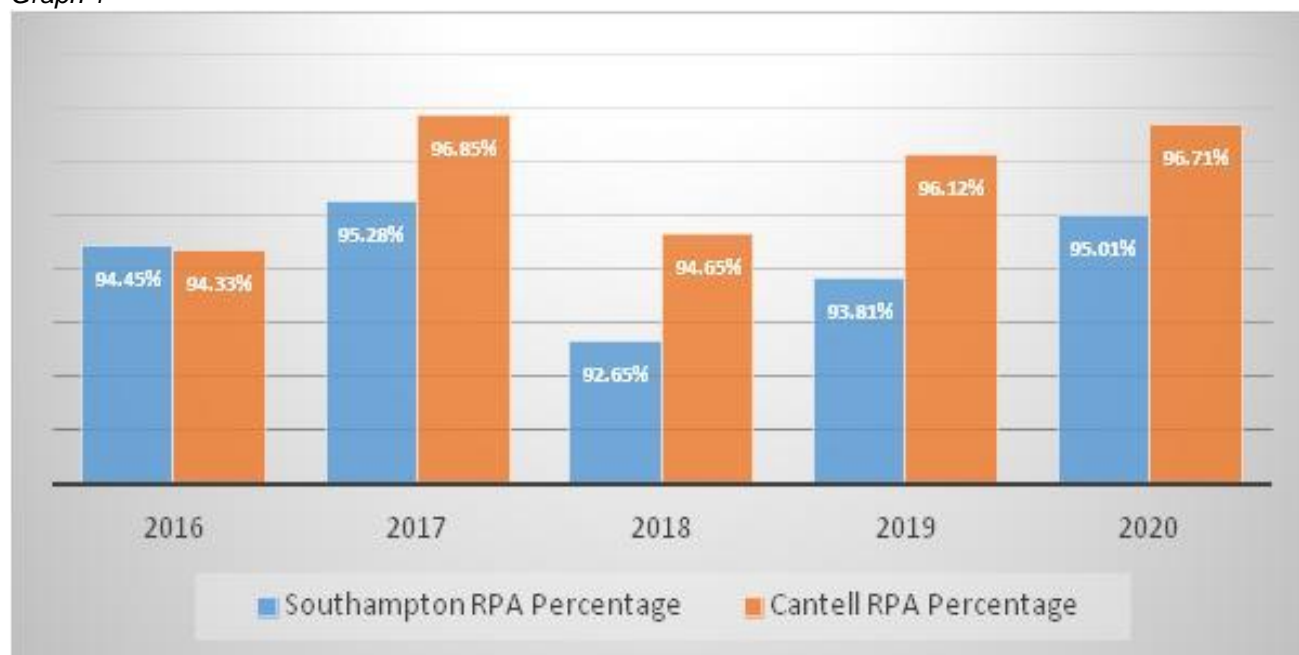

Further Education Establishments Attended

Certain factors, such as the courses offered by an FE establishment, can greatly affect the gender ratio of those who attend. Table 6 shows the establishments attended, as of 1st November 2020, by the Year 11 leavers from Cantell School who continued in full-time education at establishment level. The figures include any young people academically aged Year 11 who are repeating a year of statutory education.

The data in table 6 is only for the five most popular establishments. Year 11 leavers also attended Sparsholt College, Peter Symonds College, Fareham College and others.

Intended Destination of Year 11 Pupils

The 'Intended Destination' is used in Year 11 by Careers Advisers as a tool to identify the young persons expected transition path. It can therefore be used to supplement the information available to a Careers Advisor when assessing the priority of a young persons need. The individual's information is collected between the 1st September and the 31st May of year 11.

Tables 7 and 8 show the 1st choice Intended Destinations of Year 11 leavers and whether their destination on 1st November 2020 was the same as their intended.

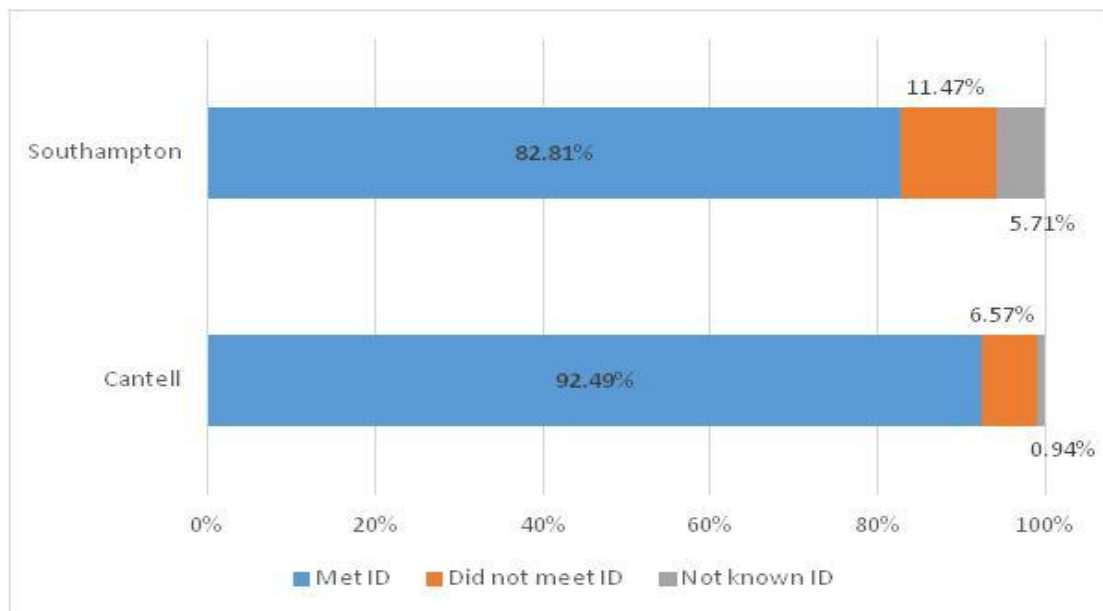

September Guarantee Offers of Year 11 Pupils

The September Guarantee is a Government commitment to offer a suitable place in education or training to all young people reaching the statutory school leaving age in either 2019 or 2020. This is part of a wider process of preparing and supporting young people to remain in learning post-16 so that they get the skills and qualifications they need to succeed, and to reduce the risk of becoming NEET (not in education, employment or training).

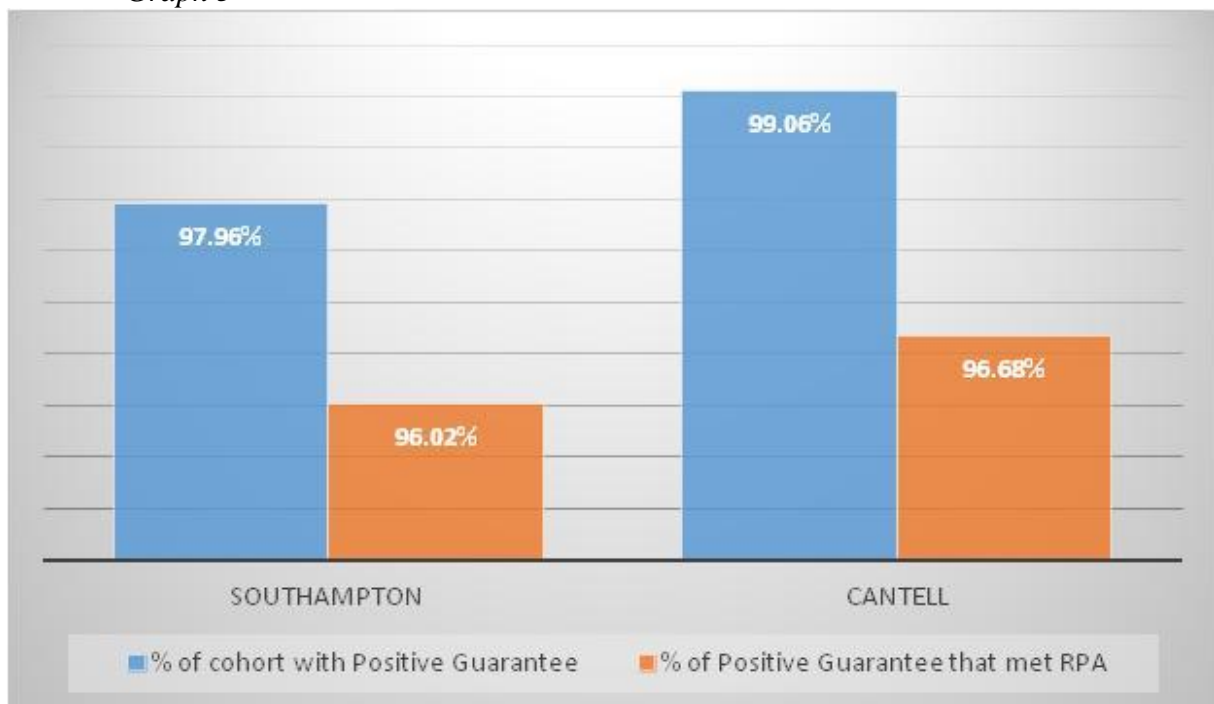
Table 9 shows how many Year 11s received a September Guarantee offer and whether they progressed into a destination that met their statutory duty to continue in learning (RPA) or did not.
